Confession for 2012

As Orthodox Christians we are expected to at least come to the Sacrament of Confession during the four Fasting periods of the Church year:

1. Nativity Fast (November 15th – December 24th)
2. Great Lent (February 27th – April 8th)
3. Apostles Fast (June 11th – June 28th)
4. Dormition Fast (August 1st – August 14th)

Great Feasts of the Orthodox Church for 2012

The Great Feasts (major feasts) of the Orthodox Church are the major celebrations throughout the liturgical year. While various saints and events are celebrated with significance on the local level, the entire Church celebrates together thirteen feasts above all the rest, Pascha and the Twelve Great Feasts.

1. September 8 (Thursday) The Nativity of the Theotokos
2. September 14 (Wednesday) The Exaltation of the Cross
3. November 21 (Monday) The Presentation of the Theotokos
4. December 25 (Sunday) The Nativity of Christ / Christmas
5. January 6 (Friday) The Baptism of Christ – Theophany, also called Epiphany
The Great Blessing of Water
6. February 2 (Thursday) The Presentation of Jesus at the Temple
The blessing of candles
7. March 25 (Sunday) The Annunciation of the Theotokos
8. April 8th (Sunday) The Entry into Jerusalem or Palm Sunday
The blessing of palms and pussywillows
9. May 24th (Thursday) The Ascension of Christ (40 Days after Pascha)
10. June 3rd (Sunday) Pentecost (50 Days after Pascha)
11. August 6 (Monday) The Transfiguration
The blessing of grapes and fruit
12. August 15 (Wednesday) The Dormition (Falling Asleep) of the Theotokos
The blessing of herbs
